Maths has seen us learning about inverse operations to help us check the answers to problems already worked out.

Our science learning involved us in investigating different materials to find out which were the hardest.

In Geography we have been learning about the different climates in South America and deciding which one would suit us best.

We welcomed Cranwell Aviation Museum into our class this week also taught us about different inspiring people and animals who have been awarded prestigious medals for their bravery. The children tried to write a telegram using only their thumbs and bandaged fingers. They also

had the opportunity to dress up as an evacuee.

Another week has flown by, and Otter class have been as busy as ever. In English and Topic, we have been learning about the Anglo-Saxon hero, Beowulf, sequencing and retelling the story. 
